Giving to the Air Force Enlisted Village (AFEV)

People give to the AFEV for many different reasons. Most people give because of a firm belief in our purpose.

The Village's primary mission is to provide a home and financial assistance to widows of retired enlisted Air Force members. Those indigent widows with the greatest need have priority. Low pay and frequent military moves leave some spouses without the opportunity for careers, home equities, retirement plans or any significant assets. Our organization works to ensure safe, secure housing among others of their own generation and life experiences.

Housing is provided at three locations, Teresa Village in Fort Walton Beach, Florida, Bob Hope Village in nearby Shalimar, and at Hawthorn House, our assisted living residence located on the Bob Hope Village campus. All three are only minutes from Eglin Air Force Base and Hurlburt Field.

All donations are tax deductible and are recognized in our newsletter. Changes in donor status are also recognized.

Sustaining Donor

A goal of AFEV President and CEO Jim Binnicker was the development of an allotment program in 2001. This program helps to fund the ongoing work of all our facilities and prepare us for the future.

As Chief Binnicker explained, "The allotment program is painless - didn't see it - didn't miss it. This program will allow the Village to move forward in achieving its goal of life care much faster." Chief Binnicker noted that the allotment program's potential is unlimited, "If we can get a large percentage of allotments, we'll be able to not only build facilities we so desperately need, but sustain operations as well."

Leaving a Legacy

Planned Gift Overview

A planned gift is, by definition, one legally provided for during the donor's lifetime, but whose principal benefits don't accrue until sometime in the future, usually upon the death of the donor or other income beneficiary. In this type of gift, the donor retains an income interest in assets committed to the Air Force Enlisted Village and receives significant income, capital gains and estate tax reduction. Planned gifts are placed in the AFEV's permanent endowment, unless otherwise indicated. Only the annual earnings of the endowment are spent in support of the programs.

Gifts by Bequest or Will

Contributions to the AFEV Endowment can be accomplished by designating a fixed dollar amount, percentage of an estate, or the entire estate to the AFEV upon the individual's death. Types of Bequests include:

Percentage - With this type of arrangement, a person can designate the AFEV to receive a specific amount expressed in terms of a percent. If circumstances should vary the size



of the estate over the years, the gift remains proportionately the same.

Residuary - This is utilized if someone wants to give the AFEV all remaining property after debts, taxes, expenses and all other bequests have been fulfilled

Specific - In this bequest, a donor designates a specific dollar amount or a specific pieces of property, such as securities, real estate, tangible personal property, etc.

Contingent - The donor specifies the bequest is made to the Village under a certain condition, such as the death of another beneficiary.

SUGGESTED LANGUAGE:

Suggested bequest and codicil language, which is a way of adding to a present Will, is shown here:

Suggested Will Bequest Language:

"I will give, devise and bequest to the Air Force Enlisted Village, Inc., a Florida nonprofit 501(c)(3) corporation (insert the sum or description of property), to be used for the benefit of said Village in such a manner as the Board of Directors thereof may direct.

Suggested Codicil to Last Will and Testament:

"I, _____, hereby amend my Last Will and Testament, executed on the ____ day of _____ in the year _____. I direct that all provisions of that Will remain in effect, but direct in addition that the Air Force Enlisted Village, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation shall receive (insert sum or description of property) to be used for the benefit of said Village in such a manner as the Board of Directors thereof may direct.

Giving Through Life Insurance

Among the many ways available of giving, life insurance provides the greatest flexibility for contributing a gift of any size - large or small - at a relatively low cost. You can use life insurance for giving by:

- * Taking out a new policy naming the AFEV as the owner and beneficiary.

* Changing an existing policy naming AFEV owner and irrevocable beneficiary.

* Sharing - If the AFEV is named as co-beneficiary, it's possible to share the proceeds with other beneficiaries.

Personal and family needs always come first. Careful planning can help ensure all assets are utilized to their fullest potential. Gifts of life insurance not only offer flexibility, but also provide a way to make a much larger gift than the donor may have thought possible.

Charitable Remainder Trusts

Another avenue available to those who wish to make a gift to the AFEV is known as a Charitable Remainder Trust. This is an agreement by which the creator of the trust, or another person, will receive income for life and the AFEV receives the trust fund upon the death of the life beneficiary.

The advantages of this type of gift are many. Donors/creators of charitable remainder trusts:

- Provide for an income to be paid to them or another person for life and even to a surviving beneficiary for his or her lifetime before the trust fund becomes available for AFEV use.

- Relieve themselves of the management burden of property placed in the trust and secure the benefits of professional management, either by the AFEV or another trustee of their choice.

- Enjoy the satisfaction of assuring the AFEV's continued progress and development.

Charitable Gift Annuity

In exchange for the donor's gift, the AFEV will guarantee an annual income to one or more people designated by the donor. The gift and a portion of the annual payment is tax-free.

A variant of this annuity is the deferred payment charitable gift annuity, in which the initial date of the start of annuity payments is deferred from the contract date by at least one year.
